Tax Reform

House, Senate score rare legislative win

- Estate tax
- Allowing equipment depreciation
- Write-offs for net interest expenses preserved for small businesses
- Provision for co-ops raising concerns



Agenda After Tax Reform

- Tax Reform package implementation
- Technical tax reform corrections coming
- Next battles: Budget, spending limits
- Other issues: Debt limit * Immigration (DACA)
 Disaster aid * Biodiesel tax incentive
 Cotton and dairy program changes
- Farm bill: May be one of easier bills to pass, but...



Trump Remaking Federal Judiciary

Trump working with Sen. McConnell

- Trump has nominated over 60 judges...
 Filling more vacancies than Obama entire first year
- Another 160 court openings...
 99% of federal legal disputes
- Supreme Court: More potential openings ahead
 ???... Kennedy * Ginsberg

Numbers favor GOP in Senate, but...; Off-year election puts House in play

26 Democratic Senate seats up

10 in states Trump carried

5 in states Trump won by 19 points or more

Only 8 GOP seats


Will GOP expand current 51-49 majority?

 Dems need net gain of 24 seats

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

Trade Policy: Hot Button Issue

Anger Mounts on Trump Trade Policies, Impacts

- Trump withdraws from TPP
 Japanese officials still trying to woo Trump to return
- Trump threatens to end NAFTA, KORUS, CUBA
 Favors bilaterals over multilateral accords

But no bilateral talks have started
Undoing a lot of trade openings in Cuba from Obama term

Others inking new trade agreements: EU-Japan, etc.


U.S. takes aggressive positions


- Big changes for auto/parts origin, dairy, produce, etc.
- <u>Canada, Mexico</u> reject many hardline U.S. positions
- <u>Timeline</u>: 6th round Jan. 23-28 in Montreal, Canada
 7th round in Mexico in February
- Does Trump really want to walk away?
 - If NAFTA 2.0 succeeds, will Congress approve?
 - If Trump bolts NAFTA, would Congress reject?
 - Impacts if NAFTA collapses

Trade With Canada, Mexico

Trump States Depend Heavily on Nafta

Many states that voted Republican send a large share of their total exports to Mexico and Canada.






Trade With Canada, Mexico

If NAFTA Collapses


Ag industry would have negative implications

- Would hurt overall U.S. economy
- Would cause a big squeeze to some sectors and states
- Could impact stock markets
- Some factory work would move north from Mexico, but...
- U.S. would lose a net 256,000 jobs over three to five years
- Among the losers:

Auto, food, and apparel makers that have crafted efficient supply chains around duty-free passage of parts and goods across borders

- First time since 1954 that an all-GOP government could pass a farm bill.
- Can they do it?



Issues Ahead

Proposed changes need lots of funding


- Crop insurance: Watch amendments, but...
- CRP cap increase: Offsets found via lower rental rates
- ARC: Just one change (10-year avg.): \$450 million one year
- PLC boost: Wheat wants boost from \$5.50 ref. price, but...
- Cotton safety net: Offsets found but...
- Dairy safety net: Changes proposed... MPP, LGM programs
- Vaccine bank to combat FMD: \$150 million annually?

- Infrastructure Timing around State of Union
- Renewable Fuel Standard (RFS) program
- Biodiesel tax incentive
- Biodiesel sanctions: Argentina, Indonesia

Corn Outlook

- March corn \$3.46. <u>\$3.35-\$3.55</u> next 3 months
- Dec corn \$3.80. \$3.40 if yields normal; \$4 plus if not
- USDA: 2017 <u>crop slightly bigger</u> than expected
- U.S. corn <u>carryover approaching 2.5 bil. bu.</u>
- 2018: Around 1 mil. more corn acres

Soybean Outlook

- March \$9.60. \$9.40-\$9.80 next 3 months
- Nov \$9.83. \$9.25-\$10 if normal yields; \$10.75-\$11 if crop is cut by 200 mil. bu. (5%)
- USDA: <u>Cut exports</u> 65 mil. bu.
- U.S. carryover: 470 mil. bu., highest s/u ratio 11 years
- Improving weather in Brazil; hot, dry in Argentina
- 2018: About <u>1 mil. acres lower U.S. plantings</u>



SRW Wheat Outlook

- March \$4.20. <u>\$4.10-\$4.50 next 3 months</u>
- Sept \$4.60. If rains come, \$4.35; \$5 if rains inadequate
- USDA: Winter wheat <u>seedings 1.5 mil. above trade</u>
- U.S. carryover: 989 mil. bu.
- Dec. 1 wheat stocks: 25 mil. bu. above trade
- <u>Dryness</u> in Plains, into Dakotas and Midwest



Meat Sector Outlook

- Larger meat supplies & solid demand, but...
- Exports are the key
- Rebuilding cattle herd means more beef output ahead
- Total U.S. meat output projected sharply higher '18

Cattle

- Price decline overdone
- Better hedging opportunities this spring

Hogs

- Futures showing signs of topping, but...
- Ongoing strength in cash hog market
- Strong packer demand, but margins tightening
- Pork exports robust

Dairy Outlook

- U.S. milk prod. increases ease...
- But global market challenging
- Larger competing supplies will limit U.S. dairy exports
